Emergency Guidelines

Security Office 720-733-6963

- Medical Emergencies: Call the Security Office immediately.
- First Aid: Direct patrons to the Information Booths for basic first aid supplies.
- Lost Children: Escort the child to the Information Booth and contact the Security
 Office.
- Loose Livestock: Do not attempt to pursue. Call the Security Office right away.
- Disorderly Patrons: Contact the Security Office for assistance.
- Activists or Protesters: Do not engage. Notify the Security Office immediately.
- Public Emergency: Your safety is the top priority. Follow instructions and remain calm.
- Emergency Messages: Pre-recorded announcements may be broadcast in the event of severe weather or other emergencies.
- Severe Weather: Seek shelter in the nearest permanent building or facility.
- If You Call 911: Always also notify the Security Office so they can guide first responders to the correct location.

- Severe Weather Take shelter in the closest building to you and direct others while you make your way there.
