

Rides are limited to pre-registered kids ages 5-7 and less than 50.0 pounds wearing the clothes and shoes they are wearing on the ride. Entry fee is \$25 and is made online at time of registration. No refunds will be issued in the event the child does not make weight requirement or is a no-show. Registration includes admittance for child and one chaperone. All others must purchase a grounds admission ticket.

Long-sleeved shirts and pants required. Boots or tennis shoes required – NO SANDALS OR OPEN-TOED SHOES ALLOWED. Safety vest and helmet are provided and must be worn by rider. No spurs and riders must ride forward. Participation waiver is required and is part of the online registration process.

Top 10 scores of each Mutton Bustin' session will have the opportunity to ride at the ticketed rodeo performance later the same day. Family will be able to watch mutton bustin' in the bleachers and will be provided a wrist band.

Like professional rodeo events, time and score count, but all these aspiring cowboys and cowgirls receive a participation ribbon. Sorry pardner, no re-rides and the judges' decision is final.
